## **Prior Learning**

The Year 2021 curriculum builds on prior learning of KS2 Art and Design, and pupils should be taught to develop techniques, including control and of materials, with creativity, experimentation and an increasing awareness of different kinds of art, craft and design.

Pupils should have been taught:

- to create sketch books to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas.
- to improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials [for example, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay].
- about great artists, architects, and designers in history.

#### Curriculum Intent – What are the curriculum aims?

The Year 7 art aims are to produce creative work, exploring their ideas and recording their experiences. Students should become proficient in drawing, painting, sculpture and other art, craft and design techniques. In their work they should learn to evaluate and analyse creative works using the language of art, craft and design. Additionally, they should know about great artists, craft makers and designers, and understand the historical and cultural development of their art forms.
